ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE MANCHESTER AND SALFORD

Boys' and Girls' Refuges and Homes,

AND CHILDREN'S AID SOCIETY,

FOR THE YEAR 1913.

WE have the satisfaction of recording another completed year of service on behalf of the poorest children of our city, and in presenting this forty-fourth Annual Report are tempted to congratulate ourselves on our age as an Institution. Forty-four years have elapsed since in its humble beginning the night shelter for homeless boys was opened in a spirit of true compassion and as a simple act of Christian duty.

Beginning of the Work.

In the first year, 1870, one hundred and ten children were dealt with; these were poor lads admitted literally from the streets where they earned a casual livelihood by day, and slept at night, if the coppers for a bed at the lodging house were not forthcoming. The effort gradually extended its scope, meeting the wider need as it was realised, and now as we end our forty-fourth year find we have dealt with 5,550 poor children during the twelve months in one capacity or another. Throughout this long period a public institution has been administered for the community, but the reclamation and care of the individual child has been the primary object of the Committee and workers alike from year to year.

Increased Care of Poor Children.

It is a great satisfaction to those who have been associated with the work from its early years and can recall the conditions of street children then, to see the improvement which has taken place, due doubtless to many and varied agencies, but testifying to the broad fact that the nation has realised, though slowly, the paramount importance of caring for the children.

Institutions such as ours have shewn during the last generation what can and ought to be done for destitute and necessitous children and have materially educated public opinion in the direction of a more sympathetic treatment of such children. Poor Law Guardians and others now shew a spirit of emulation in the provision made for the true welfare of the children coming under their care. During these years we have seen in thousands of cases the remarkable effect of a changed environment, the speech, manners, and habits of little children being transformed under wise and kindly training.

Much Remains to be Done.

It is quite true, however, that there are still conditions and surroundings of thousands of little children in our land appalling in their influence of physical and moral degradation. We have some evidence of it at our Children's Shelter every day. Children born and reared under the conditions still prevailing in our slum districts have little chance of becoming respectable citizens, and the responsibility does not lie with them but largely with the community. Better conditions for poor children will come more quickly when

the community fully realises two simple facts, first the value of the child life as an asset of unlimited possibilities for good to the nation, and second, that voluntary agencies such as our own are not equal to the problem of doing justice to the need of the child though they have shewn and are shewing what can be done by rescue, care, and training. The resources of the nation should be at the call of such a work, and its management largely directed by voluntary workers of experience. No expenditure would be too great, for the salvation of poor children from physical and moral ruin cannot be expressed in terms of cash. We have no doubt that some day these sentiments will be accepted as simple truisms.

We are glad to testify from practical knowledge that Manchester compares very favourably with other cities in regard to the condition of its necessitous children.

Summary of the Year's Work.

Our work during the past year has been characterised by its usual activity in many directions on behalf of poor children, details of which are given on subsequent pages. Some 400 to 500 children have been maintained in the various Homes, from the little child in the Orphan Home to the young man in his apprenticeship at the Institute. There has been a constant stream of distressed children passing through the Open-All-Night Shelter in the city, children on remand from the Police Courts, children lost or ill-treated, run-aways, girls in moral danger, and many another. Thousands of the poorest boys and girls of our city have been given a week's holiday at the Sea-Side Home, Lytham,

or the Camp at Birkdale. Children of a certain class have been sent to our Canadian Home breaking the connection with demoralising surroundings in this country. Help has been given in countless ways to many others. It is impossible to state also what has been involved in visits, investigation and correspondence, but the object has been one—a continuance of that spirit of compassion towards suffering children which first brought the work into being.

We are glad to record that the number of absolutely destitute cases shews a diminution. There is a class of children just above these, very needy, and it has been our privilege to admit some during the year, children of widows and of persons failing in health and circumstances to whom it has been a great comfort and relief to know their little ones were cared for.

Extent of the Work.

The Institution now comprises sixteen distinct branches, each of which is in active operation on behalf of poor and needy children. The figures which follow shew the extent and variety of the work in a general way: in addition to these we have had during the year a large number of applications for temporary help and advice which is willingly given as far as possible.

The number of applications during the year was 588—boys 480, girls 108—from Manchester, Salford, and adjacent districts. Every case is carefully considered and investigated, some cases involving a good deal of time and patience in the effort to ascertain the information necessary to decide how far we can help.

The Year's Admissions.

Three-hundred-and-sixty-nine of these children were found eligible and admitted to one or other of the branches. Many of these cases were pathetic in the history of their surroundings, and it was a great gratification to be able to give them permanent help. These 369 children, with the 424 under our care at the beginning of the year, made a total of 793 in the various branches.

The Central Refuge.

The whole Institution is administered from this central branch. The Committee meet here regularly, and members of the staff are always available to receive applications and give advice. No child is refused admission if apparently destitute; admission is, of course, followed by immediate investigation.

At this Central Branch there is accommodation for 120 boys. It comprises besides the usual dormitories and domestic offices, reading and games rooms, play-ground, swimming bath, and is well equipped for its special work. There are also five industrial departments for the training and occupation of the boys,

Shoemaking, Carpentry, Tailoring, Printing, and Firewood-making.

Each shop has its fully qualified foreman and produces good work both for our own requirements and for outside customers. We should be glad if our friends would pay a visit to these and see them in active operation.

Working Youths' Home and Institute.

The elder youths are passed on to this branch from the Central Refuge continuing their employment in the workshops or filling situations in the city. For a sum of ten shillings per week each member has full board, a separate cubicle, use of sitting room, reading rooms, baths, gymnasium, and all the advantages of a young men's club. If there are vacancies applications from youths coming to work in the city and requiring safe and comfortable lodgings are considered.

School Boys' Homes.

These two Homes in Strangeways are occupied by young boys who attend the neighbouring Municipal School and are under training of our good masters and matrons until old enough to leave school and pass on to the Central Refuge and into one of the workshops there. Some of the boys here are children of poor widows who find it impossible to maintain a large family of young children.

Orphan Homes.

These Orphanages are situate in George Street, Cheetham Hill, and comprise the following, named after the original donors. One Home is filled with neglected mother-less children.

No. 2-The Langworthy Home, girls.

No. 4-The Garnett Home, boys.

No. 6-The Crossley Home, boys.

No. 8-The Higgins Home, Motherless Children.

No. 10-The Atkinson Home, boys.

No. 12-The Schoolgirls' Home, girls.

Each Home has a "mother," helper, and from 16 to 20 children living a very true family life. The children attend the neighbouring day school in ordinary dress, not wearing any distinctive uniform.


Rosen Hallas Girls' Home.

The work here among poor, destitute, elder girls is one of the most interesting and important of all our branches. They are received often from dangerous moral surroundings, and it is a real gratification to know that as a result of their training here they become almost without exception good, useful members of society.


A small band from this Home sails every year to our Canadian Branch where they are placed out in farm homes and do well. It is important in some cases to remove girls from associations in Manchester which in all probability would endanger their future.

Bethesda Home for Cripple and Incurable Children.

This Home is filled with little children, suffering from various ailments, discharged from, or unsuitable for, the ordinary hospitals, and coming from surroundings of destitution or great poverty. It is generally acknowledged as meeting a real need in our great city. The children are

lovingly cared for by the matron and nurses. In many cases they receive great benefit and are returned to friends comparatively well. Here, as in all the Homes of the Institution, the admission is not by votes but by decision of Committee after careful investigation.

The Ever Open Door.

The Children's Shelter at 3, Chatham Street, Piccadilly, is the city branch for the reception of homeless, destitute, or ill-treated children. Three-hundred-and-ninety-two were received during the year. Of this number 113 were brought in by the police and others between 10 o'clock at night and 4 in the morning in all conditions of need. There is no question of the importance to the whole community of having in the centre of the city a "Place of Safety" for wandering and homeless children and for friendless girls up to 18 years of age. The cases admitted here are investigated at once and friends communicated with where there are any; if the children are found to be destitute they are passed on to one of the permanent Homes. This Home is also a Remand Home for juveniles from the Police Courts, 197 being received last year.

Sea-Side Home, Lytham.

This is a most interesting feature of our many operations, providing a change and rest for poor, delicate, or convalescent children. It is a great boon and pleasure for a child weak and ailing to leave the slum of the city and to spend a fortnight or three weeks in the pure sea-side air with plenty of good food. The Home is open all the year round, but as we have only twenty beds it is very inadequate to

meet the need in the summer when many poor girls if not actually ailing need the change so much. We refer to the proposed enlargement on another page.

Summer Camp at Birkdale.

Here we have a very busy time from May to September providing a week's holiday for the poorest lads of our city and district. The Camp is well equipped and is situate at Birkdale on land near the shore generously granted year after year for this purpose by Chas. J. Weld-Blundell, Esq., the Lord of the Manor. It is a great week for poor boys recommended by workers in the slum districts and is not only a splendid treat but of great benefit to the health of the lads and so far, to the good of the community generally. The large number of 3,846 children were given the holiday last year without any mishap. The summer was an ideal one for camping.


We would acknowledge with sincere appreciation the work of the Sub-Committee in charge of this branch. Few can realize how much is involved in carrying out the almost innumerable details involved in the administration.

Messenger and Shoeblack Brigades.

One-hundred-and-fourteen poor boys not resident in the Institution but coming from poor homes have been employed in these Brigades. They are found employment, and the 5/- to 8/- per week which they earn is very acceptable at home where often the mother is a widow. Afterwards the boy is found a situation to which he is transferred often with

a first class character. 76 have been so placed during the year. The lads have delivered 44,276 messages and distributed 7,762,000 circulars.

Police Court Mission.

In connection with this branch our officers at the City and County Police Courts have dealt with 244 cases of children and young people charged with various offences. They have been able to advise and help, and their assistance has been highly appreciated by the Magistrates. Where necessary we have admitted some children to the Institution.


At the Prison Gate.

We were led to begin this Mission many years ago when it was not unusual to see boys and girls issuing from the gaol. Though now dealing chiefly with adults, it has been continued in the interests of the poor prisoners who are discharged every morning from the neighbouring gaol. An invitation is given at the Prison Gate to the simple breakfast provided in the Mission Hall and a kindly word is spoken, and in some cases material help is provided in the shape of a cast-off garment or lodgings for a night or two. It is all greatly appreciated and we know of cases where it has meant their entire reformation. Last year the number of discharged prisoners met was 10,835 of whom 8,743 accepted the invitation to the Mission Hall.

New Sea-Side Home.

It is with some regret that we are not able to announce in this Report the completion of the scheme for an extension of our Sea-Side Home, owing to the difficulty of securing a suitable house or site near the sea. Our Home at Lytham with its twenty beds is quite inadequate in view of the number of needy and deserving applicants. We have to select the most needy from a physical standpoint and help them as far as our accommodation will allow. But there are many others to whom a week or two at the sea-side would be of incalculable benefit-nay, in some cases, would, we think, almost make the difference between life and death. Then there is another class of poor girls living in the squalid and crowded parts of our city, who, while not actually ailing, are in great need of a holiday-a week in fresh invigorating air with an abundance of wholesome food. Poor boys are practically provided with such a week at the Boys' Camp.

It has been felt that to meet this need it would be necessary to secure new premises, a suitable house which could be adapted or a site for building a new Home to accommodate some fifty or sixty children with an annexe which could be opened during the summer months for holiday cases. This scheme would cost about £5,000. From the accounts it will be seen that at the beginning of the year we had a balance in hand for this object of £2,128. We are glad to announce a very generous gift and proposal made during the year by a friend who at present desires

to be unnamed. He is keenly interested in this effort to do more for poor delicate girls of Manchester and Salford, and has sent us a generous contribution of £1,000 with the promise of an additional £500 if we can secure the balance to complete the scheme. We have received other contributions and promises since and now only need about £700 to provide the estimated cost. We trust this need may make its appeal to some friends who could help the scheme substantially, though we should, of course, much appreciate any donations for this special object. We were interested to read what Vice-Chancellor Hopkinson said a little while ago about holidays for poor children-"The effect of sending children into the country was not merely physical; it had a tremendous influence on the mind and soul, and those who helped to bring brightness into the lives of the children revived some of the pleasantest memories of their own lives."

Marchmont Home, Canada.

As previously intimated the Committee arranged to secure this Receiving Home in Ontario as their permanent property. The purchase money was set aside out of special amounts received in 1911, and the conveyance of the property has now been completed. In some respects it makes no difference to the emigration work as Rev. R. Wallace who has so long carried on the Home as an emigration centre for children has received and supervised the young emigrants sent out year by year from the Manchester Institution. The children will still be received and oversighted from there,

but in view of Mr. and Mrs. Wallace's retirement new arrangements had to be made for the management and work generally. After careful consideration the Committee appointed Mr. and Mrs. Herbert O. Knight, to the positions of Superintendent and Matron of "Marchmont," and have assurance, from their character and experience, that they will in every way promote the highest interests of the children and continue to maintain the high reputation of the Home both with the farmers and other residents of the Belleville district, and with the Canadian Government Authorities, whose inspectors in the past have given such favourable reports of its management and influence.

Mr. and Mrs. Knight went out in charge of the boys' party numbering 36, and Miss Pickford of our Rosen Hallas Home took out the party of 14 girls in May. There were numerous applications and good employers or foster parents were found for every child. The children are regularly visited by Mr. Knight and reports in every case sent to us at home. Marchmont Home is always available for the return of any child who may be unwell or not quite happy in his or her surroundings.

The cost of outfit, passage, etc., is £12 per child which practically makes a life-provision, for the boy or girl is maintained from the first and at a certain age receives wages ultimately becoming self-supporting and in the case of many of the boys taking up land to cultivate himself. Some friends pay the expenses of a boy or girl and we supply a photo of the child with some particulars of its history and afterwards furnish copies of the Canadian reports to the donors as they come to hand.

Ways and Means.

There are many duties devolving on the administrators and staff of a large Institution like ours in maintaining the efficiency of the various branches—duties requiring care and forethought, and bringing with them a certain amount of strain if not anxiety. They are, however, cheerfully undertaken in the interests of poor, neglected children, and have their reward in seeing the improvement made in the appearance and character of the children as the days pass by. It is when, to what we may call this happy burden of caring for the children, is added difficulty in providing the necessary funds that real anxiety begins to be felt by those responsible.


In referring to our need just now we would point out as we have done before that there is no diminution of interest in our work and that the subscription list is as extensive as ever though we have lost recently some old friends who were generous subscribers of large amounts. Our assured annual income, has, however, never been equal to the amount needed to provide for all the operations of the Charity, and has been supplemented by special gifts and legacies from year to year. The income from this latter source has not been as large as usual and some of it has been required for special purposes, extensive alterations, structural repairs, etc., during the last two years and has, therefore, not been available for ordinary purposes, hence the deficiency on ordinary accounts which, with the balance from the previous year, amounts now to over £5,000. So large a deficiency is, of course, a matter of anxiety to the Committee who are most desirous that none of the agencies promoting the welfare of the poorest children of our city should be rendered in any degree less efficient through lack of means. We have no claim on national or municipal funds, though we do work in the vital interests of the city and nation alike, and have to look to the voluntary gifts of those able to provide the sinews of a war which is waged night and day with poverty, degradation, and sin on behalf of little children.

If we could but present our case in all its urgency and importance to some who are able to help substantially in meeting this need we are sure such assistance would be forthcoming. It is so difficult by the written page to convey to the point of full realisation the hunger of a little child; the alleviation of pain in the little, bed-fast cripple; the need of a few weeks by the sea for a delicate girl from the slums; the befriending of a young delinquent in the police court; the despair of the discharged prisoner seeking help; the longing for a week's holiday in Camp by those who dwell all the year round in the meanest of streets. These and similar experiences multiplied by scores, by hundreds, and even by thousands during the year are such as love and pity can alone meet expressed in terms of generous gift and service.

We ought to say in this connection that the children of working age contributed during the year towards their own maintenance £2,269 18s. 4d. We welcome a visit to any of our Branches and venture to suggest that friends could not serve us better than by introducing others to a practical knowledge of the work, for sympathy and help often follow very naturally.

As the years pass there are, of course, inevitable changes in a large work like ours, some branches not experiencing the same pressure of applications, others requiring development to meet the greater demands. Then there are changes of management in some branches which with the extended term of service of many old members of the staff are likely to be more frequent in the future. During the year, as referred to in our last report, Mr. and Mrs. Wood have retired from the Central Refuge, and we have lost through death Mrs. Horne who for twenty years was the esteemed matron of the Young Men's Institute; there has also been a change of matron at the Cottage, Cheetham Hill, through the retirement of Miss Smethurst, who had also been in the service of the Committee for 20 years; we regret to record that she passed away a few months after her retirement.

Honorary Solicitors.

We venture to put as the frontispiece of our Report this year the portrait of T. Lister Farrar, Esq., who has served the Institution as Solicitor from its earliest days. We find his name as a generous contributor in our Report as early as 1871, and we are indebted to him and his partners for unstinted and gratuitous professional service for over forty years. What that means in view of the gradual extension of the Institution during that long period and the almost innumerable and varied points of a legal character which have arisen is impossible for us as laymen to say. We can, however, bear unqualified testimony to the sound and valuable advice which has always been at the disposal of the Committee, to the sympathetic consideration of any legal difficulty, and to the unwavering courtesy with which any application for service

has been met. We most gratefully acknowledge the obligation under which Mr. Farrar and his firm have laid the Committee, an obligation, of course, we can never hope to discharge. We are sure, however, that the consciousness of having promoted the interests of the Institution in its work amongst the poor children of the city has been a real reward.

Conclusion.

In closing this Report the Committee desire to acknowledge with gratitude the support given to them by all the members of their large staff in the management of the various Homes and Branches, and they greatly appreciate the devotion and loyalty which have again characterised their service throughout another year.



Howson Ray, Cheetham Hill; Doctors Barlow and Fisher, Lytham; to Mr. W. and Mr. H. Simms as Dentists for the Homes at Strangeways; and Mr. A. T. Spaven, Dentist, for the Cheetham Hill Homes; also to Dr. Walsh and Dr. Brown, who have specially helped in the work of the Summer Camp; and to Dr. Young for services rendered at the Children's Shelter.

We are also under a debt of gratitude to the Board of Management of the Salford Royal Hospital, who are always ready to admit cases requiring hospital treatment: The Governors of the Thomas Porter Equipment Fund have again most generously helped in providing the outfit of children passed on to situations at home and abroad, and we gratefully recognise their valuable assistance.

We would assure all our Collectors, the Teachers of the Sunday and week evening classes, the members of Working Parties, and all those who took part in the Annual Sale of Work, that their interest in the Institution and the practical help they have rendered are highly appreciated by the Committee and are thankfully acknowledged.

To all who in any way, either by gifts, active service, loving interest, prayerful sympathy, have contributed to the success of another year's work, the Committee, in sending forth this report, tender their heartfelt thanks.

MEDICAL REPORTS.

Strangeways Homes.

During the past year my professional duties at the Refuge and adjoining Homes have been extremely light. This fortunate condition may be easily understood when I say that our motto is "Prevention is better than cure." However, one bright lad at the Refuge developed Enteric Fever, and died at Monsall Hospital. We have never been able to ascertain the source of his infection—but as it proved to be an isolated case, I should not be surprised if the purchase of an ice cream in the streets was the responsible cause; otherwise, I have nothing unsatisfactory to report.

Our Health Report for the last twelve months seems pretty much what we are now accustomed to, viz.:—a fair proportion of children's everyday ailments, a very moderate amount of severe and acute illness, very few accidents, and a comparatively small death-rate. The only death during the last year was caused by Tubercle, and of this fell disease we have had distinctly less than in former years. The children as a body seem happy, well-groomed and well fed, and continue to reflect great credit on the staff that care for them.




