ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE MANCHESTER AND SALFORD

Boys' and Girls' Refuges and Homes,

AND CHILDREN'S AID SOCIETY,

FOR THE YEAR, 1914.

NO record of the work of an English philanthropic public institution having to do with the care of poor children for the year 1914 can be written without reference to the national crisis created by the terrible European war declared in the early days of August. Few will forget the quick transition in those mid-summer days from a nation absorbed in peaceful pursuits to one stunned at first and then springing to arms in the cause of righteousness.

As an Institution we were quickly affected in the matter of food supplies and prices, then by the enlistment of many of our elder apprentices, and the consequent dis-organisation to some extent of the workshops, and later by the non-renewal of some subscriptions, and the admission of several motherless children of men on active service.

The Annual Report of the Institution is therefore not normal this year in some respects. It will, however, be of interest we trust to the many friends who by gifts and service have

enabled the Committee to complete the Forty-fifth year of work on behalf of homeless and necessitous children. We briefly recount the work of the many branches with some statistics shewing the extent of the operations.

Before we do this, however, we may be allowed for the sake of new friends to say a word as to the beginning of the Institution. It was in January, 1870, that the first door was opened for a few street boys, who were found by two devoted Ragged School Teachers to be absolutely without friends or shelter. In that first year 110 poor lads were dealt with, this year (1914) 4,381 children were helped in one way or another. Mr. W. T. Browne, who was the first master, and laid the foundation of our Institution, and who was afterwards Governor of Chetham's College, passed away during the year under review.

The year 1870 saw the passing of the great Education Act, by which the State sought to establish the elementary right of every child to some degree of education. Since then the poor child has been gradually, though slowly, coming into its own, the State realizing more and more the need of protecting and cherishing the young life of the nation. We have been very tardy as a people in seeking to discharge this imperative duty, for notwithstanding the legislation enacted from time to time during almost half a century thousands of children are still living under conditions which practically make their physical and moral welfare almost impossible. It is a sad reflection to think that the awful experience of this war may suggest more effectually than times of peace and prosperity the paramount value of the children to the nation and empire. As an Institution however, we look back upon

forty-five years' work in the interests of poor children, and gratified as we are with the good effect in thousands of individual lives during these years, we have the additional satisfaction of knowing that Societies like ours in their efforts on behalf of poor children have been an example and inspiration to the State shewing what can and ought to be done for this most needy class of the community.

Certain Continental nations have in some respects been far ahead of us in legislating for necessitous children; the motive may have been to organise for national defence, but surely in our beloved land we ought to do as much for the sake of the children themselves. We are glad to think that in recent years the public conscience has been touched to a finer issue in this matter, and it will be a satisfaction to all our citizens to know that Manchester compares very favourably with other cities in its care of poor children.

Extent of the Work.

There are now sixteen permanent Homes besides the Summer Camp, Messenger and Shoeblack Brigades, Police Court Mission, Prison Gate Mission, all active on behalf of destitute, orphaned, crippled, delicate or neglected children. The statistics that follow shew the number dealt with in the respective branches. In addition to these we have given help and advice to a large number of temporary cases.

The number of applications during the year was 643, boys 509, girls 134. They were all local cases from Manches-

ter, Salford, and adjacent localities. Each case was investigated and considered, some of the applicants giving a good deal of trouble before all the facts were ascertained.

The Year's Admissions.

Four hundred and sixty one of these children were admitted to one or other of the branches, some with very sad histories, twenty-two being "war children," motherless children of men gone on active service, or others. It was a great satisfaction to receive these cases from their surroundings of poverty and distress. These 461 children, with the 391 under our care at the beginning of the year made a total of 852 in the various Homes.

The following table shews the average number resident and the total number dealt with during 1914.

STRANGEWAYS HOMES.

Central Refuge.

This is the original Home of the many branches, removed after 12 months at Quay St. Deansgate, to its present position in Frances St., Strangeways: it has grown from two small cottages to extensive buildings, comprising accommodation for 120 boys with the various workshops, Sunday Service Hall, Offices, etc. The whole Institution is administered from here by the Committee who meet regularly. Applications for admissions are received here, no child being refused admission if apparently destitute. Admission is, of course, followed by immediate investigation. The boys of school age attend the Municipal School in Southall Street, while boys of working age are employed in the five industrial departments.

Shoemaking, Tailoring, Carpentry, Printing, and Firewood Making.

Each shop has its fully qualified foreman. Several youths joined the army or navy during the later months of the year.

The health of the boys at the Strangeways Homes has, on the whole been very satisfactory. Dr. Boutflower's care and attention are much appreciated at these Homes.

Working Youths' Home and Institute.

This is part of the building which occupies a prominent position on Gt. Ducie Street, Strangeways. The Home is a comfortable one chiefly occupied by youths who have passed through the Central Refuge, and are employed in the city or in the adjoining workshops. Each resident has full board, a separate cubicle, use of Sitting Room, News Room, Games Room, Baths, Gymnasium, etc., at a cost of 10/- per week inclusive. Applications from young men coming to the workshops or warehouses in the city, and requiring a safe home are favourably considered. One result of the war has been that more than one half of the members have gone into training, or on active service; instead of having forty to fifty young fellows here we closed the year with eighteen. We hope to see them home again at the close of the war. On another page we give a Roll of Honour of present and old boys now serving in the forces.

Little Boys' Homes.

These two Homes adjoining the last named accommodate little boys who attend the neighbouring Municipal School. Some are orphans, others fatherless or motherless, several are children of men at the front to whom it has been a great comfort to know their children were safely placed

before they went on active service; some of the children have come to us from dire poverty and immoral surroundings, and it has been pathetic to see how they respond to the fatherly and motherly care to which previously they have been strangers. One of these Homes was vacated at the beginning of the war, and offered for the use of Belgian Refugees. It was found ultimately however that it would not be required for this purpose.

CHEETHAM HILL HOMES.

This group of Homes, nine in number, in and near George Street, form a little colony, where some 200 children are cared for, and should be visited by all who desire to form a just estimate of the extent and variety of the work.

Six Orphan Homes.

These are occupied principally by little boys and girls who have lost both parents; one is reserved however, for neglected motherless children. Each Home has a family of sixteen to twenty children, with a 'Mother' and a Helper, living a simple family life. The children do not wear any distinctive uniform, and attend the neighbouring Day School.

On Sundays the different Homes attend one or other of the Churches in the locality.


These six Homes are named after the original donors— "Langworthy," "Garnett," "Crossley," "Higgins," "Atkinson," "School Girls."

Elder Girls' Home and Convalescent Cottage.

The name of the house is "Rosen Hallas," situate in Bury Old Road, Cheetham Hill, and accommodates 40 elder girls. Several of the girls admitted here during the year have been rescued from very degraded surroundings, a fact which indicates an added difficulty in the subsequent training. The results however for many years, under Miss Smethurst's influence, have been very gratifying, and it is a great satisfaction to meet many of the old girls at their annual re-union at "Rosen Hallas," and to see the fruits of the sympathy and counsel exercised in the years that are past. Efficient training is given to each girl, the various departments of household service are filled by the girls in regular order, and the chief part of the laundry work for the Cheetham Hill Homes is done by them. The Cottage is used for delicate children from other Homes who need special care.

Home for Cripple Children,

"Bethesda" with its grounds has frontages to George Street and Leicester Road, Cheetham Hill, and has 70 beds for little cripple or invalid children; many, discharged from the Hospitals as incurable, are saved from returning to surroundings of extreme poverty by admission here, some come to end a brief life amid comfort and attention from matron and nurses. Dr. Fulton, and his assistant, most kindly undertake to look after these children as well as those at the other Cheetham Hill Homes. Visitors are pleased to see how happy and contented the children are notwithstanding their limitations. We fear some of these little ones have never heard of the life beyond before their admission to this "House of Mercy," and Miss Campbell tells many a pathetic story of hope and joy being kindled in the little broken life.

The Ever-Open Door.

This is a very descriptive title for our Children's Shelter in Chatham Street, Piccadilly, for necessitous children are received there any hour of the day or night. The importance of having such a Home in the centre of the city is emphasised year by year as we record the number of children received; it has indeed proved to be the "Children's Haven" for many a poor, wandering, homeless child, and for friendless or wayward girls up to 18 years of age. 554 children were received during the year 105 of them during the night, between the hours of 10 and 4. Children on remand from the Police Courts are cared for here. We regret to report that this class shews a great increase in numbers compared with previous years, many are cases of pilfering with a view to obtaining money to attend picture palaces, others are children out of control owing to fathers being away at the war. Cases admitted here are, of course investigated at once, and friends communicated with where there are any; if found to be destitute the child is passed on to one of our permanent Homes.

Sea-Side Home, Lytham.

For many years past it has been our privilege and joy to provide holidays for poor city children at this Home, and at the Birkdale Camp. Our Institution had the honour of being the pioneer in this branch of philanthropy—a work which is now recognised all over the kingdom as of great value to the children and the community alike. Our Home at Lytham has been active up to the limits of its capacity, and has given an average stay of 16 days to 310 children, many of

them being delicate or convalescent children requiring the change to sea air and abundance of nourishing food. We hope to give this benefit to a greater number of children at the larger Home at Old Colwyn referred to on another page. We shall however, leave Lytham with great regret after so many years, and shall always remember with much gratitude the kindness received there, and specially the kindly oversight given to the Home by Mr. E. R. Lightwood and his late esteemed wife.

Summer Camp at Birkdale.

This was one of the branches most adversely affected by the war. We were just in the midst of the School Holidays and were sending down each Monday to the Camp some two to three hundred poor lads from the city's crowded streets for the week's holiday when the storm broke, and the Camp was suspended and subsequently closed for the season. It was remarkable how suddenly the number of applicants fell off, instead of hundreds of boys keen to obtain the week's holiday there were scarcely a score of candidates. However, 2646 children had the week by the sea, just 800 less than in the previous year. Later in the year the Camp ground with part of the equipment was used by the military authorities. We have again to thank C. J. Weld-Blundell, Esq., for the use of the ground which he has placed at our disposal for so many years. We would also acknowledge our indebtedness to the Sub-Committee for their assiduous labours in organising and superintending this branch of the Institution.

Messenger and Shoeblack Brigade.

Eighty-eight poor boys not resident in the Institution, but coming from poor homes and needing work have been

employed in these Brigades, earning 5/- to 8/- per week, a very acceptable addition to the family's income; in many cases the boy is fatherless. Fifty-two of these lads were placed ultimately in outside situations, the demand for boys being exceptional. The small number of boys left in the Brigade has handicapped the Superintendent in carrying on the work, but we have the satisfaction of knowing that at present at least the number of poor boys needing employment is less.

Police Court Mission.

In connection with this Branch our officers at the City and County Police Courts have dealt with 230 cases of children and young people brought before the Magistrates at the Children's Court. The Bench has, we believe, highly appreciated the assistance given. 74 of the cases were placed on probation under our Officer, and on the whole have done well. Where necessary we have admitted some of the children to the Institution. We record with much regret the death of Mr. John Ashley, who was our representative at the City Police Court and Probation Officer for so many years. For a period of 32 years he was a member of our staff, and was highly esteemed by all who knew him. Mr. John P. Barrow has been appointed as his successor in both capacities.

Prison Gate Mission.

In the early days of the Institution it was a common sight to see young people discharged from the Strangeways Gaol every morning, a fact which led the Committee to establish a mission to discharged prisoners, whereby many a young life was saved from ruin. With wiser legislation and more humane methods of dealing with children and young people there are few discharged prisoners of that class. The Mission has, however, been continued in the interests of the poor men and women who come out, in many cases, hopeless, into an unsympathetic world. An invitation is given at the Prison Gate, and many respond, coming to the Mission Hall where a simple meal is provided and a kindly word said, in some cases material help is provided in the shape of a garment or means for lodgings for a night or two. During the year 9,784 prisoners were met, 7,296 of whom accepted the invitation to the Mission Hall.

Emigration.

In the Spring of the year two bands of young emigrants were sent to our Home in Canada, 22 boys in April, and 14 girls in May. These children were placed out in good farm homes by our Superintendent there, and are under his oversight. Miss Smethurst, the esteemed matron of our elder girls' Home, "Rosen Hallas," took out the girls' party, and reiterates her conviction after a long experience at home and repeated visits to the old girls in Canada that for girls who have undesirable connections here there is nothing so desirable as a good home in Canada where old associations cannot exert their baneful influence. She says referring to her visits among the girls placed out in former years "I wish our friends could go with me to see the girls in their homes, witness the hearty welcome from mistress and girl, and later hear my account of her early life and conditions as I know them, and what the life would in all probability have been had she remained in England. I am able to contrast the condition of

these girls with that of girls who, though good in themselves, could not be emigrated. Two, especially, who a year ago were sent to situations after long training did well, earned good characters, and were valued by their employers, but were persuaded to leave their situations by their own mothers with the most disastrous results, moral and physical. In one case the girl had thirty-two shillings in the bank and a good box of clothes; in less than five weeks the money was gone, the clothes pawned, and the girl morally and physically ruined. Humanly speaking, emigration would have made for this girl the difference between a life of degradation, and one of honour and usefulness."

The reports of individual cases of boys and girls are too numerous to give here, many are given in our monthly magazine time by time.

New Sea-Side Home.

In our last Annual Report we referred to the delay in carrying out the extension of this branch owing to the difficulty of finding a suitable house or site near the sea. We are glad to be able to announce now that we have secured a property on very reasonable terms eminently suitable for the purpose, at Old Colwyn, on the North Wales Coast. Possession was arranged at the end of the year, and after considerable alterations have been completed it is intended to open it as a Convalescent and Holiday Home for poor children. The opening ceremony will take place in August, 1915. It is a substantial building of stone recently occupied as a Boys' Boarding School, and stands in its own grounds

of seven acres on the high land east of Old Colwyn. It is an ideal spot open and bracing with a magnificent view which takes in the whole sweep of the Bay.

Our rented Home at Lytham, with its twenty beds, has done good service for over 30 years, but for a long time it has been quite inadequate to meet the need always presenting itself to us at Strangeways of poor delicate children requiring a few weeks by the sea with plenty of nourishing food and sympathetic care. We shall be able to deal with many more cases at this new Home. The greater distance from Manchester will mean extra cost in rail-fare, but on the other hand we shall save rent and have some revenue in produce from the large garden. We also hope to enlist the help and sympathy of the residents at Old Colwyn and Colwyn Bay, many of whom have associations with our city. We have no doubt an association of ladies might be formed who would take a personal interest in the object of the Home and win local support.

We set out some two or three years ago to obtain £5,000 for this extension. We have got in cash and promises some £4,100, and a promise of the last £500 when we can announce our list to be £4,500. As this only means an additional £400 we trust, notwithstanding the strain in financial matters, we may receive this amount and so be able to claim the fulfilment of the generous offer of one to whom we are already especially indebted in respect of this extension. The war cloud overshadows us of course in all this undertaking, but when the war is over there will probably be more need than ever of such a Home of Rest and Healing.

Ways and Means.

So large a work on behalf of poor children touching their life at so many points requires a good deal of administration and the various Homes and Agencies cannot be maintained in full efficiency without considerable expenditure as will be seen from the full statement of accounts on other pages. We regret that the net balance on these accounts shews a deficit of £500 on the year. We are thankful that under all the difficult circumstances of the latter half of the year it is not greater. We require an annual income from subscriptions and donations of about £10,000 to maintain the sixteen permanent Homes and the various agencies dealing with outside and temporary cases. We have received this year £9,276, including certain legacies.

The more serious matter and the one that gives the Committee considerable anxiety is the fact that our indebtedness to the Bank of accumulated deficits in previous years amounts to $\pounds 4,200$. The amount indeed would have been larger, but an earnest appeal last June and July had reduced it by several hundred pounds. This effort was cut short by the commencement of the war, and appeals for special objects since have made it difficult to present the claims of an old and permanent Institution. We trust this Report may be read by some able and willing to render generous help and make its own appeal on behalf of the helpless and needy children under our care.

Words of Appreciation.

The Committee realise how much they owe to the members of the Staff for their loyalty and devotion in discharging

the varied and continuous duties of their several positions throughout the year, and would record their sincere appreciation of the work done. They know how much depends on the personal influence of those who come into direct contact with the children day by day.

The work was conceived in a spirit of Christian love, and we trust is administered in dependence on, and under a sense of, the Divine Guidance and Blessing. The supreme object of the Institution is always kept in view—the care of the poor city child—destitute, neglected, cruelly-treated as so many are, and we ask for the kindly service, the generous help and prayerful interests of old and new friends as we face the future with its special difficulties in this time of national crisis.

There has been no case of sickness to give rise to any anxiety, and except for trivial and minor ailments I have had little work to do. All the boys have received every attention at the hands of those in authority over them. The buildings are in a sanitary and satisfactory condition, and the food supplied has been good, healthy, and nourishing.

Cheetham Hill Homes.

In connection with the health of our Cheetham Hill Homes, it is a pleasure to be able to record the loss of only one little one through death during the past year. The death was due to general Tuberculosis and took place in Bethesda. Tubercular Peritonitis, and Tubercle of the Lungs we have had too; but, both little patients still live. Of the infectious diseases we have had nine cases of Scarlet Fever, five of Chicken Pox, two of Mumps, and six of Measles.

There has been much the usual amount of the minor ailments, and no accidents or injuries of any moment. And the matrons and the staff generally continue to maintain the high standard of cleanliness and general training to which we are now quite accustomed.


