Group of Homes at Strangeways:

IT is a reason for profound thankfulness that during a year throughout which our nation has been engaged in a terrible war so many of its ordinary beneficent activities have been maintained. Happily free from invasion, secure within the protecting circle of her sons on sea and land, Britain has continued to care for the poor and needy in her midst, and in addition has taken up the special burden entailed by the war.

So, as an Institution, our record for the year, the Forty-Sixth year of its existence, is in many respects the same as in previous Annual Reports—the care and training of hundreds of orphan and needy children, including sixty little cripple boys and girls; the dealing with and helping hundreds of temporary cases at the City Shelter, the Police Courts, and Messenger and Shoebblack Brigades; providing a holiday at Summer Camp, and in many other ways serving the interests

of the poorest children of our city, as well as meeting discharged prisoners at the Prison Gate morning by morning, now chiefly adults.

With all this, however, there have been, as was inevitable, features inseparable from a year of war, some bringing anxiety and loss, some markedly tragic and memorable, some very welcome as shewing the truest patriotism on the part of our young people. In this association it is our sad duty to record the loss of Mr. Brian Crossley, member of our Committee who, taking up a Commission at the outbreak of war, was killed in action in Flanders on May 18th, 1915. He was the youngest member of the Committee, following his father, the late Sir Wm. Crossley Bart., as an administrator some four years ago. He thus maintained the tradition of a name which had been so long and closely associated with our work, and we had looked forward to many years of happy co-operation with him in the interests of the children. He was much esteemed by the workers, who realised that he had formed a true and practical estimate of their work. He was warmly welcomed by them and the children on his frequent visits to the Homes and workshops, and it is inexpressibly sad to think we shall not see him again.

Another consequence of the war is that nearly all our senior apprentices and youths over 16 years of age joined one or other branch of His Majesty's Forces at the beginning of the war, and have been in training or on active service during the year. Grainger, a fine young fellow from the Shoemaking department has fallen in the fight, and others have returned wounded. **Many old boys have joined the colours, altogether there are nearly 300 names on our Roll of Honour, quite a number having returned from Canada to serve the Motherland.**

In consequence of this withdrawal of labour from our workshops the Committee deemed it advisable to close the Carpentry, Tailoring, and Firewood Departments. The Printing and Shoemaking branches are still maintained. With a view to economy the Young Men's Institute has been closed for the period of the war, also the two other adjoining Homes in Gt. Ducie Street, the children being provided for at other Branches. This will save rates and management expenses in the meantime. Enquiries have been made as to the use of these premises as a Hostel, or Hospital. We shall be glad to arrange a suitable tenancy if possible.

Another loss we have sustained by reason of the war is the temporary withdrawal of the services as member of the Committee of Captain Arthur Taylor, he having taken up a Commission as Staff Captain.

In addition to the toll the war has thus levied on the Institution it is our sad duty to record the loss of our Hon. Treasurer, Mr. Henry Charlton, and our Hon. Solicitor, Mr. T. L. Farrar, both of whom have passed away during the year.

Mr. Charlton had been Hon. Treasurer, Trustee, and Member of Committee since 1883, and up to being laid aside a few years ago he took an active interest in the work of which he was a generous supporter. In the early years the founders of the Institution were greatly encouraged by Mr. Charlton's helpfulness in many ways.

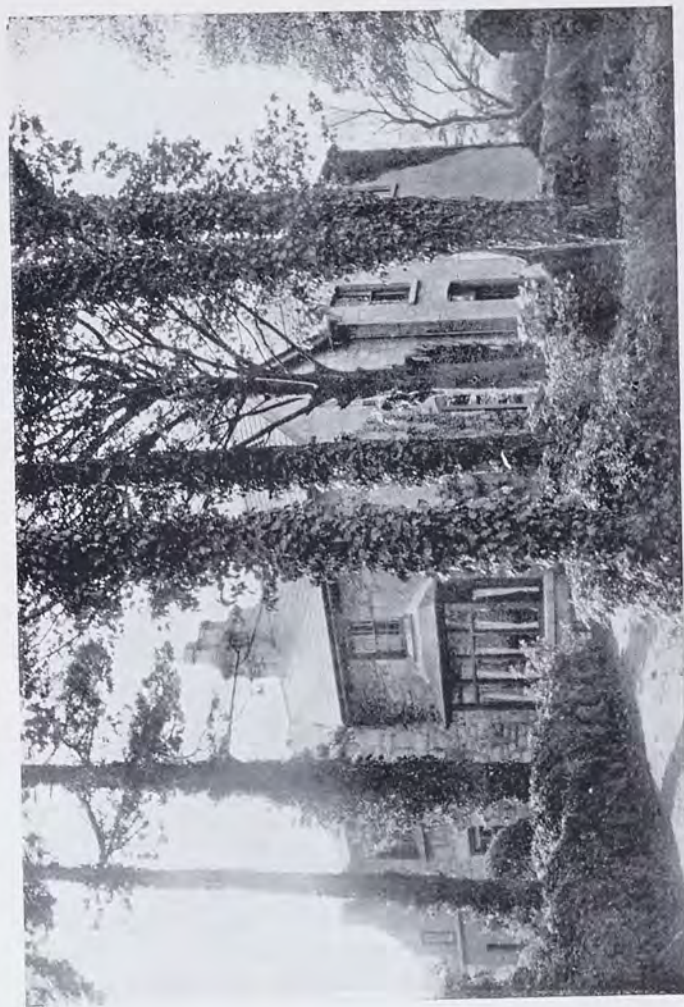
Mr. T. L. Farrar's record of service on behalf of the work was even longer, for he had been Hon. Solicitor for over 42 years, and had given during that long period unstinted professional service to the Institution. His deep in-

terest in the work on behalf of poor children, and unfailing courtesy in all matters of legal reference made it a pleasure to consult him as the necessity arose. He was also a liberal subscriber. We are glad to say that we still retain the valuable services of Messrs. Farrar & Co., the other members of his firm having been for many years equally generous in promoting the interests of the Society.

While we deplore the loss of these and other old friends we record with sincere gratitude the acquisition of several new members of Committee. Mr. Hinton A. Stewart, Mr. Robt. McDougall, Mr. Philip M. Oliver, and Mr. Fred J. Hayes, have all during the year accepted the invitation to share the responsibility of management. Mr. Hayes was already a Trustee. His father, Mr. Louis M. Hayes, was associated very closely with Mr. Leonard K. Shaw for many years in the beginning of the work.

We have already referred to the general character of the work of the year, statistics respecting which will be found on later pages. We would now briefly indicate some special features of the year's work, apart from those consequent on the war.

Perhaps the one first in importance is the completion and opening of the Sea-Side Home at Old Colwyn, which supercedes the Home at Lytham, and continues on a larger scale, the work carried on there for over 30 years, viz :—the providing of a few weeks' rest and care by the sea for poor delicate city children. We did not leave Lytham without a good deal of regret, for we remember very gratefully the kindness and support of many friends there. It did not seem possible to find suitable premises for the extension of this branch on the Lancashire Coast, hence enquiries in other directions, and

the ultimate selection of the property at Old Colwyn, which is ideal for the purpose. The purchase and adaptation of this building is the consummation of a scheme planned some years ago, and for which we had received special contributions before the war. Though the financial statement shows a debit balance on this account there is not one really, for a gift of shares (not yet realised) more than liquidates any deficiency. We are under deep obligation to the many friends who have made this much needed extension possible.

The Home is situate on the coast headland above Old Colwyn, and stands in its own grounds consisting of flower and kitchen gardens and fields, to the extent of five or six acres. The opening ceremony took place on August 7th, by the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress of Manchester (Sir Daniel McCabe and Mrs. O'Neill), under the Presidency of Sir Fredk. Smith, Bart. The Chairman of the Colwyn Bay District Council (Mr. W. Horton), and the members of the Council, gave the Lord Mayoral Party a very cordial official reception, and much local interest was shewn in the event.

During the months which followed the opening we have had increasing and gratifying evidence of the sympathy and goodwill of the Churches and residents of Old Colwyn and Colwyn Bay. A local Ladies' Auxiliary has been formed, and also a Council of gentlemen to promote the interests of this branch of our work, and to enlist the support of friends in the district. We are indeed grateful to all who have so generously responded to our appeal for practical service in connection with these organisations and in other ways.

Few who have comfortable suburban homes realise how many poor children live in the mean streets and crowded

parts of our city and borough under conditions which make good health almost impossible. Born in surroundings of poverty, ill-nourished, and scantily clothed, they are the prey of many ailments, and it has been a problem to workers among the poor how to provide the change to the Seaside so much needed, especially so during convalescence. We trust we may be able to make full use of this beautiful Home for such children through the generous support of many friends. Its usefulness will be limited only by the means at our disposal.

Summer Camp for Poor City Boys.

The Committee thought it well to consider very carefully whether the Camp at Birkdale for poor boys' holiday should be held under the special national circumstances. Several of the friends at Birkdale and Southport who have been so active and generous in connection with the Camp in past years were consulted, and it was ultimately decided to open the Camp for a restricted period, and to take down for the week's holiday the most necessitous cases, limiting the operations to the amount of support we received for this special object.

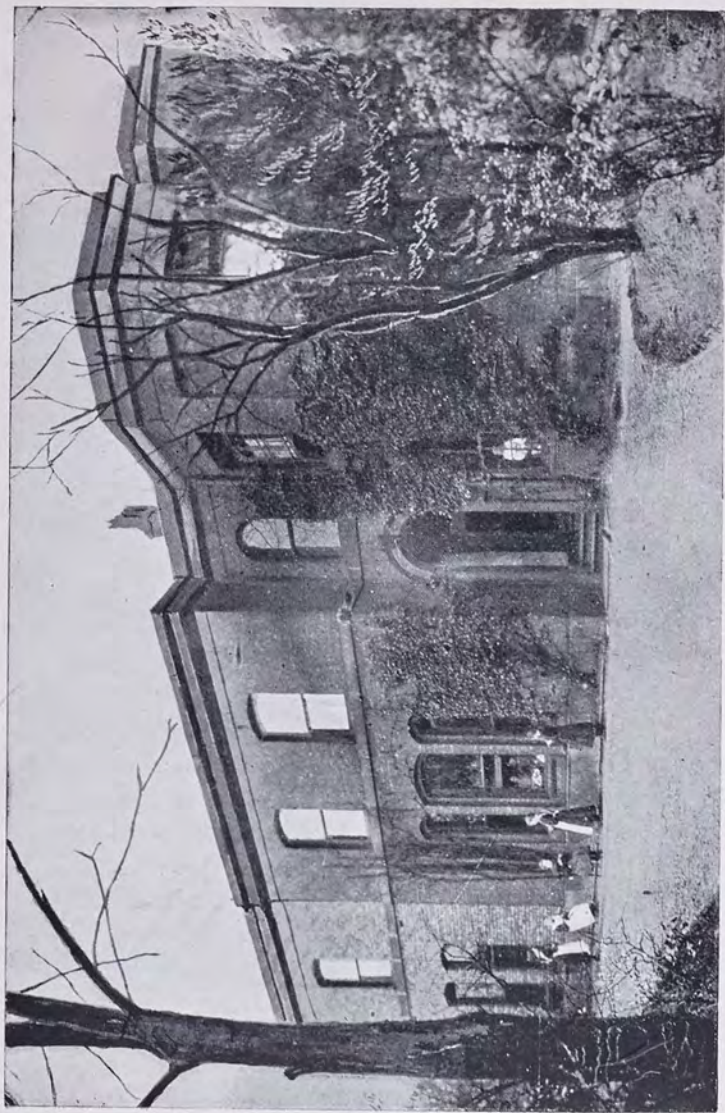
The Camp was opened by the Mayor of Salford (Ald. Worsley), in May, and thanks to the liberality of our friends we were able to keep it open until September, completing the thirty-third season of the work for the poor boys of our city and neighbourhood. 2,331 children had the week's holiday. Mr. C. J. Weld-Blundell, the Lord of the Manor, kindly allowed us to occupy the ground another year without any charge. We take this opportunity of thank-

ing him and all who have contributed to the success of the Camp. We are specially indebted as in former years to many of the residents of Southport and Birkdale who have provided the Sunday and Wednesday dinners at Camp throughout the season, and in other ways promoted the welfare and enjoyment of the lads as they came down in contingents week by week. We ought to make special mention also of the generous help received from our friends of the Royal Exchange and Stock Exchange, who, in lieu of the proceeds of the usual Cricket Match—not held this year—sent us a handsome collection of £157 11s. od. for this fund. We are also under a deep obligation to the sub-Committee and Staff who have been so devoted, in a difficult year, to the highest interests of the children.

Emigration.

The Committee decided to suspend the Emigration work this year, so far at least as the sending out the usual parties of boys and girls to Canada. Of course the supervision of the children already placed out in the farm homes there was continued as usual, this is done until the boy or girl attains the age of 18.

Like so many other questions, the one of Juvenile Emigration will have to be reviewed after the war in the light of altered conditions. Some will deprecate the sending of any of the young life out of the country; others will feel we owe something to our kinsmen over seas for their splendid response to the call of the Motherland in time of need; and our point of view will still require consideration—the protection of a certain class of children from the reassertion of degrad-

ing influences when they become of working age by emigration to one of the Colonies. While this is a matter for future consideration the Committee have felt that an immediate economy could be effected in disposing of their Canadian Distributing Home at Belleville without in any degree lessening the efficiency of this branch of the work. The opportunity of doing this came through an offer from the Committee of the Sheltering Home, Liverpool, to purchase "Marchmont," and to continue to maintain it for their own juvenile emigration work, and to receive and supervise any children we might send to Canada in the future. This Liverpool Society which has been established for many years, is almost exclusively engaged in emigration work, and this arrangement is really only a removal of their head quarters in Canada from Quebec province to Ontario. We have every confidence that the work so long carried on at Marchmont Home in the interests of the children will be continued wisely and efficiently as a branch of the Liverpool Institution. The transfer of the property was made during the year.

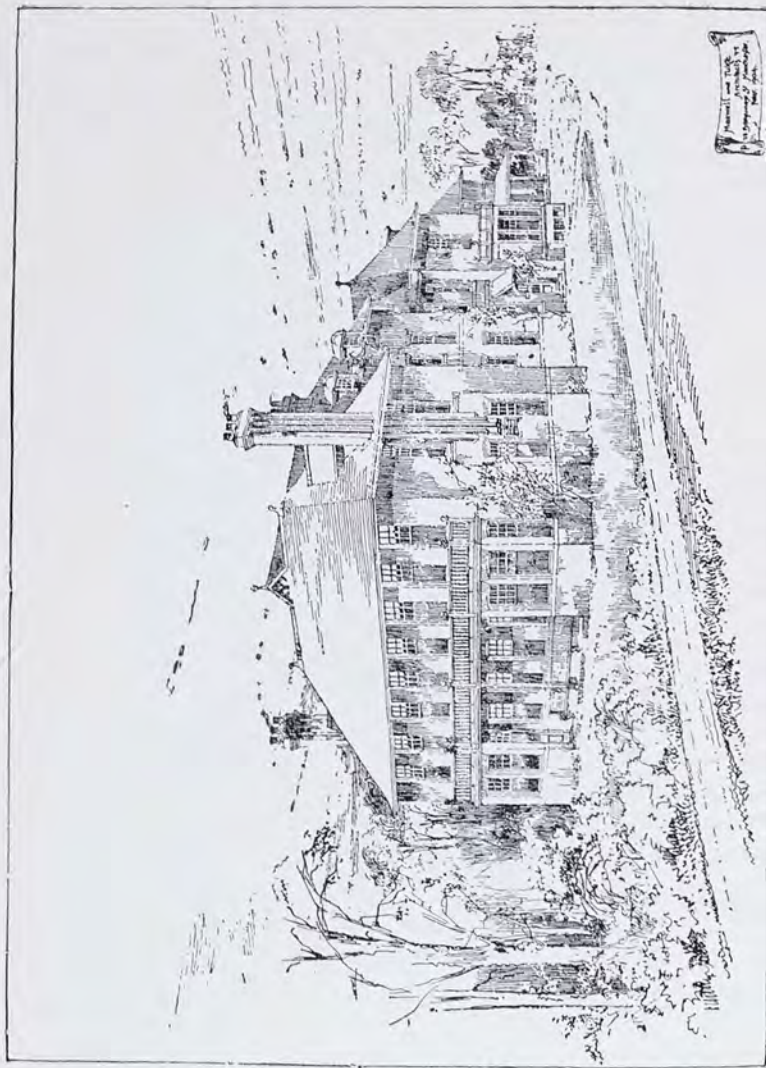
Prison Gate Mission.

A word is also necessary in respect to a change which has been made during the year in connection with the work among discharged prisoners, which our Committee inaugurated and have maintained since 1887. In the early days many young people came out of prison morning by morning, and it was felt to be an essential part of our work as an Institution to seek to reclaim them if possible from a downward career. Hence the establishment of the Prison Gate Mission, which has dealt with thousands of prisoners, young and old, every

year. For some time past however, owing to wiser legislation like the First Offenders' Act and Probation Act, and more humane methods, few young people have been sent to prison, and the Mission has dealt almost exclusively with adults. Under these altered conditions it has been arranged for this branch to be transferred to the Manchester City Mission, which will be responsible for its maintenance, though still carried on in our Mission Room at Strangeways, which is in close proximity to the Gaol. Figures for the year in respect to these various branches are given on later pages.

Children's Shelter.

We do not propose in this Report to dwell on each department of the work further than to give the number of children dealt with, but we should like to call attention to one or two features which are somewhat peculiar to the year. One is in connection with the number of children received at the Children's Shelter, the Ever-Open Door, in the city. This branch is open for the reception of the homeless, lost, or ill-used children at any hour of the day or night. It is also used for the admission of juvenile offenders from the Police Courts while on remand, under the provision of "The Children Act," instead of as formerly being sent to prison or workhouse. It is a disquieting fact that the number of these remand cases has greatly increased during the past year over the previous year, and over the average for a number of years. The number of cases dealt with in the Juvenile Police Court last year was 1,049 compared with 673 in 1914. Our record at the Shelter shows 404 children received on remand during 1915, and 231 during 1914, the

average during the last eight years being 201. This is not peculiar to Manchester, for enquiries made in other cities reveal a similar sad and regrettable record for the year. The charges on which these children are before the Court are also on the whole of a more serious character, the great majority being not the minor misdemeanours of begging, obstruction, without guardian etc., but the actual crimes of stealing, house-breaking, etc. Such an increase in the number of these juvenile delinquents—mainly boys—is an effect which must have its adequate cause however difficult it may be to determine it precisely. There is a consensus of opinion however, that it is in a great measure associated directly, or indirectly, with the war.

There is the spirit of adventure which is almost inevitable under present conditions, and is by no means an unhealthy one, but unfortunately finds in so many cases no outlet but in lawlessness. Then there is the absence of the father from so many homes, and in many cases the mother following an occupation away from home; also the fewer hours at School; and though not a consequence of the war, the fascination of the cheap picture palaces with their sensations so exciting to the young mind. There is evidence that the same results of the war influence prevail in Germany, while from France where the Education Authority have rigorously enforced the usual School attendance, there comes no evidence of an increased number of juvenile offenders. If the exigencies of the time preclude the keeping of the boys at School full time, it would be a great gain if every lad could be incorporated into some organisation such as the Scout Movement, and Boys' Brigade, where his wit and his energy could find free play to the benefit of himself and his elders. The difficulty

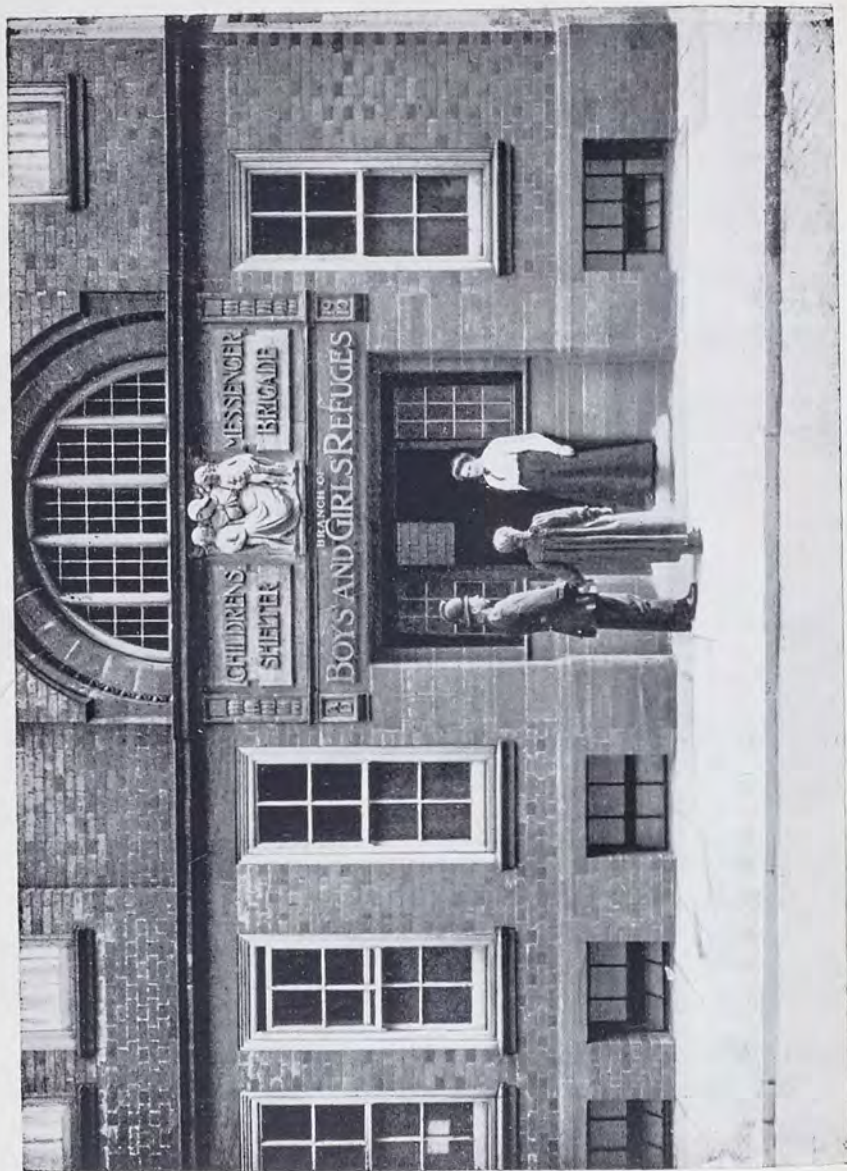


Orphan Homes, George Street, Cheetam Hill.

in that direction may be of course the absence of social workers, but there is no doubt that personal interest in these children directly or in connection with some organisation is the most effective method of protecting them from the temptations so prevalent in these days. We are glad to hear testimony to the value of the probation system in connection with these juvenile offenders. Our inspector, who is the probation officer for boys at the City Police Court has had 44 cases placed under his care during the year, instead as in the old days the boy being sent to prison, and thereafter branded as a criminal. Of 75 probationers dealt with during 1915, most have done well, and made a real effort to regain their character under the stimulus of Mr. Barrow's oversight and encouragement.

Ways and Means.

While the work among the children has for its ultimate object their true welfare in every sense—to make them worthy and self-respecting citizens of our great Empire, we realise that all our efforts are dependent upon the supply of ways and means by the many friends of the Institution, supplemented by the earnings of the children. We aim at character, but in a very real sense the work has a bread and butter basis; the first requirement is that the children be fed and clothed. Even poor homeless children, now happy and cared for in our Homes, are hungry with decided regularity, and their boots and clothing do not renew themselves without cost. **Without State or Municipal aid we have been supported by voluntary subscriptions in a work begun in a spirit of Christian sympathy for poor, helpless children, and we have no doubt such support will be continued if the need is realised.**

OPEN DAY AND NIGHT.

The work is one for the community as well as the children. Even in these war days we have much to be thankful for, but our requirements are not fully met, and we are in danger of being overshadowed by the special appeals for so many worthy objects.

The increased prices of provisions and other necessaries, 40 to 50 per cent., and the diminished earnings and profits in our Industrial Departments, amounting to some £1,500 largely through the enlistment of our elder lads, seriously affect our finances. We are grateful for the generous response to our special appeal at the end of the year, but regret the income for the year did not meet the expenditure by about £1,000. **This with the accumulated deficits of the last two or three years, makes our indebtedness over £5,000, a position which gives the Committee considerable anxiety. As already stated economies have been instituted as far as possible by the closing of some of the branches, at least for the duration of the war, but we urgently need increased income, and earnestly appeal therefore for additional help—special donations towards the deficiency and an extended subscription list to meet the annual outlay.**

The great amount available for charitable purposes has been to some extent proved in connection with the war. If the object is worthy the response is generous; the resources are there if the good-will can be enlisted. We venture to think our work for the poor children is worthy of adequate support, and will be more than ever needful when the war is over.

The difficulties caused by the war have not been confined to finances and the general administration, but have in some

departments brought an anxious experience to several worthy members of our staff. In closing three of our workshops the foremen have been dispensed with, but fortunately have now obtained other employment. The Superintendents and helpers of the Gt. Ducie Street Homes, Strangeways, are being assisted in seeking other appointments. At the Central Refuge with its full complement of 120 boys, Mr. and Mrs. Johnson have had a strenuous year, both Assistant Masters were called up for military service, and there has been great difficulty in securing suitable help. Notwithstanding the trying conditions, however, the boys have been well cared for, and have given decided evidence of the Superintendent's kindly and methodical discipline to which they have responded in a gratifying way. The formation of Scout patrols with all its means of interest and order, has been conducive to a good spirit of service and comradeship among the boys.

The Committee realise the devotion of the various members of the Staff throughout the year, and would record their appreciation of the good work done in the several Homes and departments. They are glad to think that the aim of those brought into daily contact with the children is to promote their highest welfare.

In closing this Report we venture to think the reader will see that in this time of national crisis our Institution is doing its part. It has sent the finest of its young manhood to the King's service; it has received into its care the motherless children of men at the front; and its daily and hourly work among hundreds of children is to train them to be good citizens of the Empire. The conservation of the child life of the nation was never so imperative and we ask for the prayer-

ful interest and generous support of our fellows in this work for the child, the community, and the nation alike.

Some details of the number of applications and admissions and of the children dealt with in the various Homes and Branches are given below.

Extent of the Work.

In addition to the permanent Homes, the Summer Camp, Messenger and Shoeblack Brigades, Police Court Mission, Prison Gate Mission, have been active on behalf of destitute, orphaned, crippled, delicate or neglected children. The statistics that follow shew the number dealt with in the respective branches. In addition to these we have given help and advice to many temporary cases.

The number of applications during the year was 918, boys 778, girls 140. They were all local cases from Manchester, Salford, and adjacent localities.

The Year's Admissions.

Six hundred and twenty-nine of these children were admitted to one or other of the branches, some with very sad histories. It was a great satisfaction to rescue these cases from their surroundings of poverty and distress. These 629 children, with the 366 under our care at the beginning of the year, made a total of 995 dealt with in the various Homes. Several were the motherless children of men gone on active service.

The following table shews the average number resident and the total number dealt with during 1915.

We are also under a debt of gratitude to the Board of Management of the Salford Royal Hospital, who are always ready to admit cases requiring hospital treatment: The Governors of the Thomas Porter Equipment Fund have again most generously helped in providing the outfit of children passed on to situations at home and abroad, and we gratefully recognise their valuable assistance.

We would assure all our Collectors, the Teachers of the Sunday and week evening classes, the members of Working Parties, and all those who took part in the Annual Sale of Work, that their interest in the Institution and the practical help they have rendered are highly appreciated by the Committee and are thankfully acknowledged.

To all who in any way, either by gifts, active service, loving interest, prayerful sympathy, have contributed to the success of another year's work, the Committee, in sending forth this report, tender their heartfelt thanks.

MEDICAL REPORT.

Strangeways Homes.

My professional duties at the Boys' Refuge Central Homes are now much curtailed owing to the temporary closure of the Young Men's Institute, the Boys' Brigade Home and Emigration Training Home, and my work is now entirely confined to the Central Refuge Home. I have had no cases involving the least anxiety, and they have been mostly of a surgical nature. The boys are looking healthy and vigorous and they are all well cared for, the Master, Mr. Johnson, having the great gift of combining strict discipline with much real kindness. We have had no infectious or contagious diseases to contend with and, as far as I can judge, the food, sanitary arrangements, and clothing, are entirely satisfactory.
