Inscape dog first aiders

This term some of our students had the opportunity to complete a canine first aid course which provided training that covered a number of areas such as conducting health checks and full body examinations such as checking breathing, pulse, temperature, and behaviour.

Students looked at different emergency situations including seizures, bleeding, canine shock, burns/scales and heat stroke. All the students completed emergency CPR on the practice dog and also developed the skill of bandaging a wound.



Animal assisted intervention (AAI) adventures

Our AAI program is growing everyday with students enjoying and engaging within their personal and tailored sessions. Our students have the opportunity to engage with a wide range of animals from support dogs to baby tortoises.

We thrive to build on the opportunities of delivering AAI with different species of

animals. This now includes our work with The Manchester Donkey Sanctuary who offer 1:1 and group donkey AA courses, including Donkey Facilitated Learning (DFL), Wellbeing with Donkeys (WWD), Donkey Interactive programme (DIP) and Donkey Management programmes (DMP).

We cannot wait to grow AAI at Inscape further and we are grateful for the extended offer from The Donkey Sanctuary.

To finish off this term we had a flying visit from the reindeers and our students got to interact with 'Rudolph' and his friend 'Dasher'. 
Travel training in the community – thank you to the businesses that support our learners
