

Uniform Policy

The students at Inscape House School are proud to represent our school community. We believe that wearing a school uniform enhances this feeling of belonging. We also believe that school uniform can prevent the inevitable loss of self-esteem caused to individual students, should a family not be able or willing to provide the newest, most expensive or most fashionable clothing and equipment.

We understand that there are often good reasons why some of our students may struggle to wear a school uniform, particularly in relation to sensory needs. We have a number of different types of T-Shirts, jumpers and fleeces to suit a range of sensory needs. We would encourage all the students in the main school to wear at least one element of our school uniform. Comfortable trousers, jeans, jogging bottoms or skirts are permitted as part of our uniform.

We recognise and celebrate our students' desire to express themselves and their identity through their unique dress sense. We expect all students to avoid clothing which is revealing. We strongly discourage the wearing of jewellery aside from small stud earrings. This is both to ensure that students' health and safety is maintained as well as to prevent upset from potential loss of sentimental items. Students should wear comfortable shoes such as traditional school shoes, trainers or similar.

Students in our Post-16 department are welcome to wear uniform, but in readiness for the world of work and life beyond Inscape, we also encourage smart casual clothing.
