This sector is the part of economic and administrative life that deals with the delivery of goods and services by and for the government, whether national, regional or local.

Examples of this sectors' activity include delivering social security, urban planning and organising national defences. At the national level, Public Administration is the Central Government and civil service, based mainly in London. At the local level, it is Local Government (i.e. your local council), the police and the fire service.





Cuts in public funding mean the sector is expected to decline by an estimated 6000 jobs by 2025.
