


# Inscape House School Stakeholder survey feedback

## Their positive feedback suggests that students are being supported effectively with their emotional wellbeing.




#### Students are supported effectively with their emotional wellbeing




#### Stakeholders mostly agreed students make good progress in autism-specific areas for development, such as communication and self-regulation.

### Positive feedback was received regarding school promoting equality, diversity and inclusion effectively.




